Projects range from landscape master planning right through to detail design and implementation of the landscape. The projects vary from institutional projects to corporate, recreational and sports facilities, urban and rural facilities, transport facilities, urban planning, landscape restoration and rehabilitation, nature and game parks to house gardens.
