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# **KEY CABINET DECISIONS – SEC 2.6**

On 10 December 2014 Cabinet approved a range of steps to reform the Supply Chain management (SCM) system, including

- a) SCM performance criteria to be included in the performance agreements of accounting officers as from 1 April 2015;
- b) Accounting officers to conduct a capacity review of SCM staff and to take remedial action where required;
- c) Accounting officers to brief executive authorities quarterly on the SCM performance in their department, municipalities or entities.


