

The Council for the Built Environment (CBE) is a statutory body established under the Council for the Built Environment Act, 43 of 2000 (the CBE Act). The CBE is an overarching body that coordinates certain functions of the six Councils for the Built Environment Professions (architecture, engineering, landscape architecture, project and construction management, property valuation and quantity surveying - all operating within the built environment) for the purpose of promoting and protecting the interest of the public in the built environment.



CBE has the statutory mandate to decide appeals lodged by any person aggrieved by a decision of any of the Councils for the Built Environment Professions (CBEP). The CBE is obligated by its enabling legislation to appoint an Appeal Committee to conduct appeals in terms of section 33 of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa (Act No. 208 of 1996). Appeals must be decided within 60 days of lodgement.

The CBE invites applications from suitably qualified and experienced candidates to serve on its Appeal Committee in the following roles:

- 1. Chairperson and Member( a person qualified in law and who has appropriate experience)**
- 2. Member ( professional, a person who is registered in terms of any of the Professions Acts, and who has appropriate experience )**
